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KATIE TAKES THE DRIVING SEAT

Lymphoedema is one of our most popular and valued services.

Our current head of the service, Lynn Brooks, is soon to retire. Katie, who has worked with the service since July 2023, has now trained to lead the team. We spoke to Katie to find out more about her new role and plans for the department.

Katie Greig has taken over the leadership of the popular and busy lymphoedema service following the retirement of Lynn Brooks.

"It's a very exciting opportunity and I have extremely big shoes to fill after Lynn goes because she is amazing," said Katie, who has been with the hospice for just over a year as a lymphoedema nurse therapist but who has had a quarter-of-century experience in nursing.

"What excites me about the role is the difference you can make for patients.
Lymphoedema is a chronic progressive condition that presents itself as a swelling anywhere in the body but predominantly on a limb. It affects people both physically and psychologically, particularly with self-esteem and acceptance of the new normal."

Katie, who was born and bred in Bucks and now lives near Chesham, added: "It's about being able to give truly holistic specialist care to patients. Without us, many people in South Bucks would not be able to access any treatment and support. There are currently extremely limited NHS lymphoedema services in Buckinghamshire."

The South Bucks Hospice lymphoedema service currently supports around 230 patients. The charitable service treats patients suffering from damage of the lymphatic system as a result of cancer or cancer treatment. This could be from having lymph nodes removed or having areas of the body damaged by radiotherapy.

Katie trained at the hospice in High Wycombe under the guidance of Lynn Brooks, who headed up the service for eight-and-a-half years and who had almost 50 years' experience in nursing.

She also had the support of Frances Wallington, a senior lymphoedema therapist with 20 years' experience.

Lynn, said: "I will be sad to leave my role but have loved my time here and feel very assured that the team will carry on and continue with the same professional, specialist service for patients under the leadership of Katie. I am very pleased that Katie will be leading the specialist lymphoedema service and taking it forward. She has a fantastic personality and embraces all that she has learnt and all that she is putting into practice."

We are now looking for a new lymphoedema nurse to replace Katie after her promotion.
Applicants need a nursing background, preferably specialising in palliative care or cancer, but do not need any previous experience of lymphoedema because full training will be provided.

KENDALL WALKS COAST TO COAST

A cancer patient has raised thousands of pounds for South Bucks Hospice after an epic 13-day coast-to-coast walk.

Kendall Green, 64, of Beaconsfield, walked a total of 192 miles from June 24 to July 7 to help the 'amazing work' of the hospice.

His trek from west to east was made all the more impressive because it came just six months after he had been too weak to even walk a few steps. He had been diagnosed with cancer in January 2023.


He proudly handed over a cheque to the hospice for £8,632.21 which came through donations.

"After surgery, chemotherapy and radiotherapy which left me unable to walk to the bathroom, never mind across the country, I am getting back to something resembling fitness."

The walk was from St Bees in Cumbria to Robins Hood Bay in north Yorkshire, passing through the Lake District, the Yorkshire Dales and the North York Moors. Kendall explained why he wanted to support South Bucks Hospice where he had received treatment.

"It's personal, a small charity doing amazing work for people with cancer or recovering from cancer."

THE SKY IS THE LIMIT **FOR RICHARD**

Richard Lam, a terminally-ill cancer patient, who also suffers vertigo, has raised more than £5,000 for South Bucks Hospice by jumping 13,000 feet out of a plane.

Richard, on his JustGiving page, explains that South Bucks Hospice has supported him with his terminal illness since January 2024. He therefore decided to fundraise for the charity in appreciation of the services provided and to help SBH to support others in the future.

He has attended the hospice's men's group where he met and shared experiences with other cancer patients. He has also enjoyed participating in the Tai Chi and art groups.

"South Bucks Hospice is a small organisation helping people - it supported me when I needed it so I thought this was a small thing to pay back. They do wonderful things -I think people should be made more aware of their services because more than 96% of the hospice's funding comes from donations rather than Government funding."

GRACE SETS A YEAR OF CHALLENGES

Throughout 2024 Grace has decided to take on a series of challenges to raise money for us as we have provided support for her Mum.

Grace explains, "After a few months of unknown illness and many doctor's appointments, in May 2023, our lovely mum was diagnosed with Stage 4 Neuroendocrine cancer. By June 2023, we had received the heartbreaking and life-changing news that it was incurable.

South Bucks Hospice provides care & support for people living with life-limiting and life-threatening illnesses, including workshops, support groups and various complementary therapies to help with physical & mental wellbeing.

Mum has been able to use some of their brilliant resources as extra support alongside her chemotherapy, attending nutritional workshops, support groups & even having acupuncture/massage to help with pain relief.



No tickets are required, just join us on the day.


